PIETRASANTA, Da Pietrasanta a Dubai. Dalle nicchie artistiche, per taluni nebulizzate, della Piccola Atene alle eccellenze italiane celate dietro l'opulenza degli Emirati Arabi, Un legame che vede il suo incipit nelle opere di Oliviero Rainaldi. pittore e scultore che nei diversi "altrove" del mondo recita, da anni, il ruolo di protagonista. Il 13 marzo scorso al Parco Sculture del Difc (Dubai international financial center) è andato infatti in scena il vernissage della personale di Rainaldi artista che dagli anni '90 frequenta Pietrasanta e i suoi

laboratori, vivendo a stretto contatto con l'artigiano e con una realtà che ispira, da diversi decenni, un numero crescenti di artisti o aspiranti tali.

"The nature of things" è il titolo della sua mostra: qual è il tema?

«"The nature of things" fu il titolo scelto per una mostra del 2011 che esordì a Roma nei giardini di Villa Aldobrandini e che, successivamente, si trasferì in Cina, poi Malesia, Singapore ed ora a Dubai. Le sculture presentate, allora come adesso, erano ispirate al concetto dell'acqua, attraverso soggetti mitologici e religiosi. Per Dubai ne sono state selezionate alcune».

Quante?

«Per l'esattezza 4, in bronzo: Argonauta, Battesimi Umani 1 e 2 e Caduti».

Perché Dubai?

«Sono approdato negli Emirati lo scorso anno esponendo un grande rilievo in marmo commissionato dalla Maserati per il loro centenario. In questa occasione fui notato dal Difc che, per la prima volta, ha deciso di ospitare nei suoi giardini una serie di artisti il cui esordio è stato affidato a me e Tony Craa».

In questo momento, non proprio splendido sotto diversi punti di vista, cosa rappresenta Dubai per l' arte e l'artista in genere?

«Un po' come tutta l'area del middle Est, Dubai è attualmente uno dei centri internazionalmente più attivi nell'arte contemporanea: è superfluo dire che per un artista essere presente è cosa decisamente prestigiosa».

E a proposito di prestigio, come viene considerata l'arte italiana nel mondo?

«Se escludiamo i grandi nomi storici e qualche vivente, la nostra arte è poco considerata, perché altrettanto poco conosciuta. Il motivo? A mio avviso, ciò è dovuto a una tiepida "aggressività" sia delle strutture pubbliche che private: in poche parole, siamo tra i più bravi, ma poco agguerriti».

In queste settimane è protagonista anche di un'altra rassegna, una collettiva d'arte, a Forte dei Marmi: qual è il suo legame con la Versilia?

«Frequento Pietrasanta dai primi anni novanta. E, per materiali e capacità di elaborarli, questo è un luogo che continua ad essere unico al mondo. Un piccolo centro, con un'ottima qualità di vita. E internazionalmente frequentato. Negli anni, il mio rapporto con la Versilia, si è sempre più strutturato e intensificato. Questa collettiva è la mia prima occasione espositiva sul territorio».

A proposito di Pietrasanta, definita la città d'arte per eccellenza, per le sue fonderie e per i suoi laboratori, c'è chi invece la ritiene in declino: il suo pensiero?

«Nonostante i molti, e non sempre al meglio, cambiamenti, ribadisco l'unicità del luogo».

Secondo Oliviero Rainaldi, l'arte, oggi più che ieri, è una filiera economica?

«Da Giotto in poi, il sistema dell'arte occidentale, è strettamente connesso con il sistema mondano. Tuttavia a me sembra che mai come in questo frangente storico la relazione tra le "due sostanze" si sia fortemente sbilanciata a favore della speculazione economica. I più seguono e comprano arte con la stessa metodologia di chi gioca in borsa».

Facciamo un passo indietro: la sua opera romana "Conversazioni", dedicata alla figura di Papa Wojtyla, anni fa fece molto discutere: a distanza di tempo cosa ricorda di quel periodo e cosa pensa oggi della sua stessa opera?


«L'avventura di "Conversazioni" è stata un'esperienza mondiale unica e rara per un artista. Penso a tutt'oggi ciò che pensavo in quei giorni: opere che non si conformano al gusto e alla mentalità del tempo, sono destinate alla sofferenza poiché necessitano da parte del pubblico di un più lungo tempo di comprensione. La scultura dedicata al Papa polacco, pur non essendo tra le mie opere più riuscite, si propone con una formula anticonvenzionale, sia nella forma che nei contenuti: ai posteri...».


C'è una scultura o una mostra, che più di altre ricorda con particolare piacere?

«Sì, c'è: la scultura "Partenope" da poco installata nella sede della compagnia navale Grimaldi a Napoli».


Dopo Dubai quale sarà il suo prossimo progetto?

few other places in the world have demonstrated their love for the Italian lifestyle and taste for beauty as the United Arab Emirates. 

ra gli artisti che si recano in Versilia alla ricerca del materiale perfetto con cui plasmare la propria idea, a Forte dei Marmi se ne può incontrare uno la cui arte oltrepassa regole e confini. È Oliviero Rainaldi, lo scultore-pittore che sarebbe più esatto definire come un pensatore che si esprime attraverso l'arte. I frutti del suo lavoro non sono mai semplici realizzazioni isolate, nascono sempre da uno studio, una riflessione e appartengono a un più ampio ciclo di concetti riguardanti quel campo del sapere. Conoscenza che, sotto la guida dell'artista, emerge sempre nuova e affascinante, in grado di incuriosire senza mai annoiare. Le opere di Rainaldi scaturiscono dalla sintesi raggiunta dall'artista su temi filosofici, teologici e personali. È la cultura che diventa arte, facendosi gesso, bronzo, tempera e olio. Vi è la liturgia, nell'arte di Rainaldi; la religione che si fa materia e si lascia plasmare dalle mani dell'uomo, per essere compresa e fatta propria. Vi è la natura, con la quale l'arte è chiamata a danzare, in un'intrecciarsi senza sosta di opere umane e elementi vegetali. E, soprattutto, nell'arte di Oliviero Rainaldi c'è l'uomo, sempre al centro, eterno protagonista analizzato attraverso i diversi linguaggi del disegno e della grafica, della pittura e della scultura. Un'arte audace quella di Rainaldi, il quale si allontana con forza e volontà dalla tradizione ottocentesca per immergersi a pieno nella contemporaneità. Le sue sculture non hanno paura di sperimentare, a costo di suscitare critiche; il loro scopo non è quello di rappresentare la realtà quanto, piuttosto, i concetti universali che si celano dietro la banale superficie del concreto. È da Medardo Rosso il suo Maestro, che Rainaldi ha imparato che "noi non siamo che scherzi di luce", aprendo così le proprie sculture alla luce, lucidandone la superficie per permettere loro di riflettere i raggi del sole, curvandone il volume per far sì che si insinuino nei loro angoli. Un autore già acclamato a livello internazionale eppure ancora da scoprire: ecco Oliviero Rainaldi.



This artist and thinker is able to transform knowledge into art, to give it a bronze shape and make it always new and fascinating

Among the artist studios of Forte dei Marmi, one of them is Characterised by the atmosphere a 19th-century saloon: there, art crosses rules and boundaries. It is that of Oliviero Rainaldi, painter and sculptor, who is first of all a thinker that expresses himself through art. His works are never isolated creations; they always rise from research and reflection and they belong to a wider cycle of concepts about a specific area of knowledge. Under the artist's control, that knowledge always emerges new and fascinating, capable of intriguing, and it never bores. Rainaldi's works are the result of his thought about philosophical, theological and personal themes. It is culture that becomes art through gypsum, bronze, tempera and oil. There is liturgy in his art; religion becomes substance and let that man's hands shape it, in order to be totally understood. There is nature, with which art dances, in a continuous twist of human

works and vegetal elements. In Oliviero Rainaldi's art, man is always at the centre, eternal protagonist examined through the different languages of drawing, graphics, painting and sculpture. Rainaldi's art is brave. He strongly and intentionally distances himself from the 19th-century tradition to immerse himself in the contemporary world. His sculptures have no fear of experimenting, at the cost of raising critiques; their purpose is not that of representing reality, but rather the universal concepts hidden behind the ordinary surface of the concrete. Medardo Rosso is his Master, and taught Rainaldi that "we are nothing but light tricks", thus opening the doors of his sculptures to the light, polishing their surfaces to let them reflect the sunbeams, and bending the volume so that the sunbeams could weave into their corners. Oliviero Rainaldi is an author that has already been internationally recognised, and yet he is brand new.
